## The Royal Princess

- This Princess Cruise ship measures 141,000 tons and has a capacity of 3,600 passengers.
- Her amenities include a pair of public areas cantilevered over the side of the ship on the top deck—a walkway on the starboard side and a bar on the port side.
- She features expanded public areas and a wonderful central Piazza atrium.
- The ship has more dining options than previous Princess vessels and they all are very good.
- Her Royal Highness, the Duchess of Cambridge, Kate, is the godmother of the ship. They showcase her dress from the launching ceremony & display fresh flowers every day by her portrait.








## Oslo, Norway












#### 2-Day St. Petersburg Experience

   Petersburg is by a ships tour. Since it was our second visit, we took the subway tour—it was really cool!





#### Helsinki, Finland


- Helsinki is Finland's capital. It is located on a southern peninsula in the Gulf of Finland.


